2013 LEGISLATIVE SCORECARD

The National Association of Social Workers Illinois Chapter Political Action Committee (NASW IL PAC) is pleased to present its 2013 Legislative Scorecard, a source for social workers to learn how their legislators voted on key issues that impacted the social work profession and their clients. The NASW IL PAC will release its scorecard at the end of each year to ensure members know legislator's records on key economic and social work-related public policy issues, and to also recognize lawmakers who understand the importance of a strong and funded social service industry.

In building the 2013 Legislative Scorecard, the NASW IL PAC felt fewer than five votes on an issues would not give the reader a true reflection of a legislator's session and were therefore omitted. While the budget and the appropriation debate will be a strong part of the NASW IL PAC's endorsement process, they were omitted from the 2013 Legislative Scorecard due to the fact that the votes did not reflect the legislator's budget appropriations support or lack thereof during committee/amendment debates. Also, legislators who were not present for the vote did not have that absence counted against them, while legislators who chose to vote present were marked with a negative as they had the opportunity to vote for but failed to support the legislative agenda of the social work profession.

As you will see, the 2013 Legislative Scorecard shows numerous perfect scores and reflects the success that the NASW IL PAC and its members received in persuading lawmakers to vote in the interests of the social work profession and our clients. However, budget constraints and current legislation being presented will require continued diligence and participation from the social work profession. We hope you will find the 2013 Legislative Scorecard informative, and that you will share these results with your colleagues and associates. The NASW IL PAC may update this scorecard prior to the 2014 election if significant votes arise.



KEY LEGISLATIVE SESSION VOTES FOR 2013

SB10 RELIGIOUS FREEDOM AND MARRIAGE FAIRNESS ACT

Provides that: all laws of this state applicable to marriage apply equally to marriages of same-sex and different-sex couples and their children; parties to a marriage and their children, regardless of whether the marriage is of a same-sex or different-sex couple, have the same benefits, protections, and responsibilities under law. The NASW Illinois Chapter was a member of the Marriage Equality coalition and as such requested a yes vote.

Result: After delays, SB10 passed both chambers and was signed by Governor Pat Quinn.

SB26 MEDICAID EXPANSION

Provides that: beginning January 1, 2014, benefits were extended under the state's medical assistance program to persons aged 19 or older, but younger than 65, who are not otherwise eligible for medical assistance under the Code, who qualify for medical assistance under specified provisions of the Social Security Act, and who have income at or below 133% of the federal poverty level plus 5% for the applicable family size. The NASW Illinois Chapter was a strong supporter of expanding Medicaid eligibility and as such requested a yes vote.

Result: SB26 passed both chambers and was signed by Governor Pat Quinn.

SB1609 SOCIAL WORK SAFETY

Provides that: the offense of threatening a public official includes human service providers. The NASW Illinois Chapter pushed for the expanded definition of "human service provider" to include social workers working under contract from state agencies and subsequently requested a yes vote.

Result: SB1609 passed both chambers unanimously and was signed by Governor Pat Quinn.

HB1 COMPASSIONATE USE OF MEDICAL CANNABIS PILOT PROGRAM ACT

Provides that: when a person has been diagnosed by a physician as having a debilitating medical condition, the person and the person's primary caregiver may be issued a registry identification card by the Department of Public Health which permits the person or the person's primary caregiver to legally possess no more 2.5 ounces of usable cannabis during a 14-day period that is derived solely from an intrastate source. The NASW Illinois Chapter was a strong supporter of cannabis for medical purposes, and while we would like to see the listed ailments expanded, the pilot program is a positive first step. The NASW Illinois Chapter supported HB1 and requested a yes vote.

Result: HB1 passed both chambers and was signed by Governor Pat Quinn.

HB 206 (FY 2013 SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING BILL)

Provides that: funds are appropriated for various agencies to address shortfalls in funding for the current fiscal year. It includes funding to address shortages in the Department of Human Services budget for developmental disabilities services.

Result: HB206 passed both chambers and was signed by Governor Pat Quinn.

HB948

Provides that: The Department on Aging shall by rule develop standards for minimum staffing levels and staff qualifications. The Department shall by rule establish mandatory standards for the investigation of abuse, neglect, financial exploitation, or self-neglect of eligible adults and mandatory procedures for linking eligible adults to appropriate services and supports. The NASW Illinois Chapter supported HB948 and asked for a yes vote.

Result: HB948 passed both chambers and was signed by Governor Pat Quinn.

HB1017 MENTAL HEALTH CONFIDENTIALITY

This bill is an initiative of the governor's Illinois Office of Health Information Technology to amend the Mental Health and Development Disabilities (MH-DD) Confidentiality Act with respect to the disclosure of recipient information within Health Information Exchanges (HIE). The NASW Illinois Chapter supported HB1017 and requested a yes vote.

Result: 1017 passed both chambers and was signed by Governor Pat Quinn.

HB1538 MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID TRAINING

Provides that: The Department of Human Services shall establish and administer the Illinois Mental Health First Aid training program so that certified trainers can provide Illinois residents, professionals, and members of the public with training on how to identify and assist someone who is believed to be developing or has developed a mental health disorder, or an alcohol or substance abuse disorder, or who is believed to be experiencing a mental health or substance abuse crisis. The NASW Illinois Chapter strongly supported HB1538 and requested a yes vote.

Result: HB1538 passed both chambers and was signed by Governor Pat Quinn

HB2404 MINOR AGE CHANGE FOR CRIMINAL JUSTICE

Provides that: the definition of delinquent minor is changed to include a person who was under 18 (rather than 17) years of age when he or she committed an offense classified as a felony. Also changes the age concerning confidentiality of juvenile records. The NASW Illinois Chapter supported HB2404 and requested a yes vote.

Result: HB2404 passed both chambers and was signed by Governor Pat Quinn

HB2675 MEDICALLY ACCURATE SEX EDUCATION

Provides that: if a sex education class or course is offered in any of grades 6 through 12, the school district may choose and adapt a developmentally and age-appropriate, medically accurate, evidence-based, and complete sex education curriculum that meets the specific needs of its community. It also provides that the Comprehensive Health Education Program shall include the educational area of evidence-based and medically accurate information regarding sexual abstinence (instead of the area of sexual abstinence until marriage). The NASW Illinois Chapter supported HB2675 and requested a yes vote.

Result: HB2675 passed both chambers and was signed by Governor Pat Quinn
